

## OPENING PRAYER

### OPENING HYMN: CPWI 463

Come, thou fount of every blessing,  
tune my heart to sing thy praise!

**RESPONSE: As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.**

OFFICIANT: Praise ye the Lord.

**RESPONSE: The Lord's Name be praised.**

**PSALM 119:1-8 (Page 627)**

- 1 Happy are they whose way is blameless, \*  
who walk in the law of the LORD!
- 2 Happy are they who observe his decrees \*  
and seek him with all their hearts!
- 3 Who never do any wrong, \*  
but always walk in his ways.
- 4 You laid down your commandments, \*  
that we should fully keep them.
- 5 Oh, that my ways were made so direct \*  
that I might keep your statutes!
- 6 Then I should not be put to shame, \*  
when I regard all your commandments.
- 7 I will thank you with an unfeigned heart, \*  
when I have learned your righteous judgements.
- 8 I will keep your statutes; \*  
do not utterly forsake me.

**FIRST LESSON:** *Revelation 2: 1 – 7*

Here begins **the first verse of the second chapter of the Book of Revelation:**

‘To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: These are the words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand, who walks among the seven golden lampstands: <sup>2</sup> ‘I know your works, your toil and your patient endurance. I know that you cannot tolerate evildoers; you have tested those who claim to be apostles but are not, and have found them to be false. <sup>3</sup> I also know that you are enduring patiently and bearing up for the sake of my name, and that you have not grown weary. <sup>4</sup> But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first. <sup>5</sup> Remember then from what you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent. <sup>6</sup> Yet this is to your credit: you hate the works of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. <sup>7</sup> Let anyone who has an ear listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches. To everyone who conquers, I will give permission to eat from the tree of life that is in the paradise of God.’

READER: Here ends the First Lesson.

**RESPONSE: Thanks be to God.**

**OFFICE HYMN: CPWI 292**

Praise the Spirit in creation,  
breath of God, life’s origin:  
Spirit, moving on the waters,  
quicken worlds to life within,  
source of breath to all things breathing,  
life in whom all lives begin.

Praise the Spirit, close companion  
of our inmost thoughts and ways;

Tell of how the ascended Jesus  
armed a people for his own;  
how a hundred men and women  
turned the known world upside down,  
to its dark and furthest corners

Pray we then, O Lord the Spirit,  
on our lives descend in might;  
let your flame break out within us,  
fire our hearts and clear our sight,  
till, white-hot in your possession,  
we, too, set the world alight.

Praise, O praise the Holy Spirit,  
praise the Father, praise the Word,  
Source, and Truth, and Inspiration,  
Trinity in deep accord:  
through your voice which speaks within us  
we, your creatures, call you Lord.

## MAGNIFICAT

*St. Luke 1*

**M**Y soul doth magnify the Lord: and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour.  
For he hath regarded: the lowliness of his handmaiden.  
For behold, from henceforth: all generations shall call me blessed.  
For he that is mighty hath magnified me: and holy is his Name.  
And his mercy is on them that fear him: throughout all generations.  
He hath showed strength with his arm: he hath scattered the proud in the imagination  
of their hearts.  
He hath put down the mighty from their seat: and hath exalted the humble and meek.

He hath filled the hungry with good things: and the rich he hath sent empty away. He remembering his mercy hath holpen his servant Israel: as he promised to our forefathers, Abraham and his seed, for ever.

***Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost;  
As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.***

**SECOND LESSON: Matthew 22: 34 - 40**

Here begins **the thirty-fourth verse of the twenty-second chapter of the Gospel according to Matthew:**

<sup>34</sup> When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, <sup>35</sup> and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. <sup>36</sup> ‘Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?’ <sup>37</sup> He said to him, ““You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.” <sup>38</sup> This is the greatest and first commandment. <sup>39</sup> And a second is like it: “You shall love your neighbour as yourself.” <sup>40</sup> On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.’

**READER:** Here ends the Second Lesson.

**RESPONSE:** **Thanks be to God.**

**NUNC DIMITTIS**

*St. Luke 2. 29*

**L**ORD, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace: according to thy word. For mine eyes have seen: thy salvation,

Which thou hast prepared: before the face of all people;

To be a light to lighten the Gentiles: and to be the glory of thy people Israel.

***Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost;  
As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.***

**O** UR Father, which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; But deliver us from evil. **Amen.**

*Then the Officiant standing up shall say,*

OFFICIAINT: O Lord, shew thy mercy upon us.

**RESPONSE: And grant us thy salvation.**

OFFICIAINT: O Lord, save our Nation.

**RESPONSE: And mercifully hear us when we call upon thee.**

OFFICIAINT: Endue thy Ministers with righteousness.

**RESPONSE: And make thy chosen people joyful.**

OFFICIAINT: O Lord, save thy people.

**RESPONSE: And bless thine inheritance.**

OFFICIAINT: Give peace in our time, O Lord.

**RESPONSE: Because there is none other that fighteth for us, but only thou, O God.**

OFFICIAINT: O God, make clean our hearts within us.

**RESPONSE: And take not thy Holy Spirit from us.**

*Collect for Saint Luke.*

**A**LMIGHTY God, who inspired your servant Luke the physician to set forth in the Gospel the love and healing power of your Son: Graciously continue in your Church this love and power to heal, to the praise and glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

*The Second Collect at Evening Prayer.*

**O**GOD, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works do proceed; Give unto thy servants that peace which the world cannot give; that both our hearts may be set to obey thy commandments, and also that by thee, we, being defended from the fear of our enemies, may pass our time in rest and quietness; through the merits of Jesus Christ our Saviour. **Amen.**

*The Third Collect, for Aid against all Perils.*

**L**IGHTEN our darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord; and by thy great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of thy only Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

**M**AY the Divine Assistance remain with us always and may the souls of all the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. **Amen.**


